Teslin Recreation January Update

January was a bit of a quiet month in Recreation as we re-grouped following the holidays and battled with the cold temperatures that resulted in low turn-outs or the cancellation of activities. We did resume Tuesday night Hockey Games at the rink with pizza sales by Kim moved to Tuesday and Thursday at the rec-plex. We took youth in to Whitehorse on their January P.D. day, and when it was too cold for Mt. Sima we decided to go for Chinese food and a swim at CGC. We wrapped up the month with a Spa night at the Rec-Plex that featured bath bomb and soap making with Amy, hair-dos and trims by Brandy, nail painting with Roseanne and Ashley, and footcare by Patti.

February is a super exciting month with a bunch of awesome recreational things on the go.

We will kick off a 6-week, after-school Ski Program for grades 1-5 that will run Feb 5th until Spring Break. This program will start with a parent & kid social event on Wednesday, February 5th at 5:30 pm in the Mezzanine. The kids will then be on skis for the following 5 Wednesday with guest facilitator Holly Bull in the 'ski playground' we have built behind the Rec-Plex rink. This is a skill development program, so we are asking for youth to register and commit to the full 6-weeks. Please note that this ski program will take place instead of the regular after school activity program on Wednesdays. Mondays with Patty at the rec-plex will remain the same, but if your child chooses not to do the ski program,

alternative arrangements will need to be made for Wednesdays. Our guest instructor Holly will also lead some evening group skis (with dates to be determined), and fiddling instruction after school on Thursdays at the rec-plex up until spring break.

February 15 will be the Teslin Lakespiel!!!! This is a fun, family-friendly day on the lake that will feature a round-robin curling tournament, homemade soup contest, best tailgate setup contest, and licensed beer garden. The day will kickoff with a pancake breakfast put on by the Seniors committee at 8am at the Rec-Plex, with tournament play starting at 9am. Registration is \$200/team payable at VoT office, and will be limited to 10 teams. The deadline to register a team is Feb 12. You do not need to be on a team to enter the soup or tail gate contest, or to just come out and enjoy a fun day on the lake!!!

We will be taking the youth to the cabins across the lake for our Winter Camp on the February long weekend, Feb 21-24. This camp, for ages 9+, is all about getting out on the land, sharing traditional skills, and having fun. You need to sign-up with recreation by February 17. We are also looking for the support of local experts to help facilitate some activities at this camp, which could include setting net, identifying traditional trails, teaching traditional skills and sharing stories around the fire. Please speak with Lindsay or Jordan if interested in getting involved.

The archery program has continued with Sam Johnston on Fridays after school and Les Johns leading a practice at the Rec-Plex every couple weeks. Archery is a great opportunity to compete with Team Yukon at the upcoming Arctic Winter Games and North American Indigenous Games, so we encourage regular participation!! Many other identification camps for NAIG are starting in February, so please don't hesitate to discuss the opportunity for you or your child to participate!

A 'save-the-date' of March 6-8 has been issued for this years' Mini-Rendezvous and we are asking for your input and involvement in an initial planning session Feb 5 @ 7pm in the mezzanine, as we work towards rejuvenating this great community event!!

Valentine's Day, also called St. Valentine's Day, holiday (February 14) when lovers express their affection with greetings and gifts. The holiday has origins in the Roman festival of Lupercalia, held in mid-February. The festival, which celebrated the coming of spring, included fertility rites and the pairing off of women with men by lottery. At the end of the 5th century, Pope Gelasius I replaced Lupercalia with St. Valentine's Day. It came to be celebrated as a day of romance from about the 14th century.

Although there were several Christian martyrs named Valentine, the day may have taken its name from a priest who was martyred about 270 CE by the emperor Claudius II Gothicus. According to legend, the priest signed a letter "from your Valentine" to his jailer's daughter, whom he had befriended and, by some accounts, healed from blindness. Other accounts hold that it was St. Valentine of Terni, a bishop, for whom the holiday was named, though it is possible the two saints were actually one person. Another common legend states that St. Valentine defied the emperor's orders and secretly married couples to spare the husbands from war. It is for this reason that his feast day is associated with love.

Formal messages, or valentines, appeared in the 1500s, and by the late 1700s commercially printed cards were being used. The first commercial valentines in the United States were printed in the mid-1800s. Valentines commonly depict Cupid, the Roman god of love, along with hearts, traditionally

the seat of emotion. Because it was thought that the avian mating season begins in mid-February, birds also became a symbol of the day. Traditional gifts include candy and flowers, particularly red roses, a symbol of beauty and love.

The day is popular in the United States as well as in Britain, Canada, and Australia, and it is also celebrated in other countries, including Argentina, France, Mexico, and South Korea. In the Philippines, it is the most common

wedding anniversary, and mass weddings of hundreds of couples are not uncommon on that date. The holiday has expanded to expressions of affection among relatives and friends. Many schoolchildren exchange valentines with one another on this day.

Dandelion cures illnesses - Here are some ways on how to prepare.

Dandelion root has been used as a therapy for many years. It is able to treat allergies, lower cholesterol levels, to improve bile production, and to detoxify the liver. Also, dandelion has diuretic properties and good for pregnant women and for those in menopause.

Spring is the best time to harvest dandelion roots, particularly in the beginning of april. It is best to pick it from places that are less polluted, such as areas away from town and the road.

You may not know that all parts of dandelion have medicinal properties. Its leaves are rich in vitamins and you can use them in a salad, or with potatoes and eggs.

Dandelion stem has the power to relieve stomach problems, boosts the function of the gallbladder, regulates metabolism, and purifies the blood. The stem can be used to treat diabetes, while the milk from the stem can be used to remove warts.

In addition, people can use dandelion flowers to prepare homemade dandelion syrup. It will help your body to purify the blood, it also relieves a cough and improves digestion.

Dandelion Syrup Recipe

Pour 3 liters of water over 400 yellow dandelion flowers. Next cut 4 oranges and 4 lemons into slices and add to mixture. Leave for 24 hours.

After 24 hours, strain and place into a pot. Add 2 cups sugar and cook for 30 minutes.

Remove after it boils and gets thick. Place syrup in sterilized jars. Treat cold, cough or bronchitis with syrup.

Dandelion root - health benefits and properties that can fight cancer

Dandelion is long used and popular for its medicinal properties. Today, modern medicine validates the health benefits of this flower and fights cancer.

To prepare and store dandelion roots, you need to peel, cut and dry them in fresh air. Leave them to dry for 2 weeks or until they get brittle under the fingers. Once dry, place them in a jar and keep in a cool dark place.

Dandelion roots are able to clean kidneys, liver, lymph and gallbladder. It is helpful in treating gallstones, constipation, hepatitis, acne, edema and

rheumatism. Additionally, it is effective for women in prevention and treatment of problems with breastfeeding, cysts, tumors and cancer.

Dandelion Tea

Dry, chop and mince some dandelion leaves. Add half teaspoon of this mixture in a glass of water, and your tea is ready.

Mixture can be stored in a glass jar for future use.

Another method, combine 60 grams of fresh mixture and 30 grams of dried dandelion root. Place mixture in a pan with 2.5 ounces of water with pinch of salt. Bring to a boil, cover and simmer for approximately 20 minutes, Strain, and enjoy.

Yukon College Lecture Series, WED Feb 26, 12pm: The effects of climate change on two birds in the Northwest.

TARA STELEHIN, Biology Instructor and PhD Candidate, Presents: The Effects of Climate Change on Two Birds in the Northwest

Northwestern North America is predicted to have some of the greatest human-caused changes to climate globally, making study of northern-breeding birds imperative to their conservation.

Long term datasets suggest that many aerial insectivorous birds are declining rapidly from land use, toxins, and climate change impacts.

Long distance migrants and insectivores may be particularly impacted by climate change and resulting changes to communities. However, northern North America has some potential to provide small areas of refugia from climate change if organisms can disperse and if communities can support them.

Tara will give an overview of results from a multi-scaled research project investigating contributors to declines of two species of insectivorous bird, including broad-scale species distribution modeling and local investigation into phenology of birds and their insect prey.
