



## NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Before exercising certain rights of access under the Final Agreement identified below, persons must first notify the TTC lands department in one of the following ways:

Type of Access Right (Check one):

- 6.3.1 Entering, crossing, or making necessary stops on Undeveloped Settlement Land to reach adjacent Non-Settlement Land for commercial or non-commercial purposes
- 6.4.1 Government Access on Undeveloped Settlement Land to deliver, manage and maintain a Government program or project for a period of 120 consecutive days or less (Government programs or projects that will last for more than 120 consecutive days require an access permit or, failing TTC consent, an order of the Surface Rights Board)
- 6.4.2 Authorized personnel Access on Undeveloped Settlement Land to provide utilities for public purposes for a period of 120 consecutive days or less – consultation with TTC required (work that will last for more than 120 consecutive days requires an access permit or, failing TTC consent, an order of the Surface Rights Board)
- 16.12.3 Entering and/or staying on Undeveloped Category B Settlement Land for the purpose of noncommercial Harvesting of Fish and Wildlife (\*note: the requirement to notify under this regulation does not satisfy the requirement to obtain a harvest permit under applicable TTC law)
- 16.12.7 Outfitting concession holder Access to cross and make necessary stops on Settlement Land to reach that outfitting area
- 17.10.3 Timber harvesting agreement holder Access on Settlement Land to use Settlement Land for purposes related to the agreement

- 18.3.1 Existing Mineral Right holder Access on Settlement Land or Non-Settlement Land to cross and make necessary stops on Settlement Land for the purposes of exercising that right (casual or insignificant nature; on a regularly used route w/ no significant alteration of route)
- 18.3.2 Existing Mineral Right holder on Settlement Land Access to use that Parcel of Settlement Land for the purposes of exercising that right
- 18.4.1 New Mineral Right holder Access on Category B or Fee Simple Settlement Land or Non-Settlement Land to cross and make necessary stops on Settlement Land for the purposes of exercising that New Mineral Right (casual or insignificant nature; on a regularly used route w/ no significant alteration of route)
- 18.4.2 New Mineral Right holder Access on Category B or Fee Simple Settlement Land to use that Parcel of Settlement Land for the purposes of exercising that New Mineral Right (no use of heavy equipment)

**For certainty, the following types of access do not require the person exercising the right of access to notify TTC:**

- 5.15.3 Use of Waterfront Right-of-Way for travel and for non-commercial recreation including camping and sport fishing
- 6.3.2 Crossing and/or staying on Undeveloped Settlement Land for non-commercial recreational purposes
